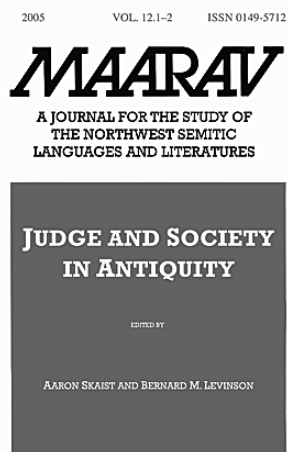
Aaron Skaist and Bernard M. Levinson (eds.)
